extra seedlings will be needed.

Landowners must replant trees if they salvage time within two years under the Oregon Forest Practices Act, unless the landowners can't obtain seedlings. The shortfall will trickle down to Christmas tree growers, too.

"We grow Douglas fir, just like the timber folks," Oregon State University Christmas tree specialist Chal Landgren said. "I think all the nursery capacity from California to British Columbia has already been taken up with people trying to get seedlings from the fires. And that'll affect Christmas tree growers as well." DESTRUCTION OF WILDFIRES IMPACTS AGRICULTURAL LABOR

Farm laborers are leaving Southern

Oregon areas devastated by wildfire because there's not enough work and

economical housing options are limited, according to a report by Capital Press (Salem, Oregon). Some 2,482 residential structures in Jackson County alone were burned down — including 18 mobile home parks and other low-income housing options — displacing hundreds of families in the process.

Aid is not keeping all farmworkers afloat, as many undocumented Latino families did not apply for FEMA assistance. However, local charities and businesses like Fry Family Farm and Harry & David have supported employees who lost their homes.

The effects of a housing shortage, insurance claims, and rebuilding efforts will be felt for years. Growers in the area fear it will severely damage the agricultural economy of the region.

Through the collaborative efforts of the companies, the Damu Flower Valley achieved the coveted 4A level national tourist site classification, and it has stopped further man-made sabotage to the mountainous area.
