

## Oakleaf Hydrangea

Hydrangea quercifolia For a brilliant display of fall colors, it's hard to top the oakleaf hydrangea's red, yellow and wine-colored foliage and large pink-bronze blooms.

Hardiness: Zones 5 to 9. Bloom time: Midsummer to autumn.

Size: 6 to 10 feet tall; 8 feet wide.

Flower color: White, changing to pinkish bronze.

Growing advice: Sun to partial shade; well-draining soil. Recommendations: Pee Wee is a compact variety; Snowflake offers double blooms.

## Coneflower

Rudbeckia Coneflowers, with their daisy-like flowers, bloom



from the summer months until late fall.

Hardiness: Zones 3 to 9. Bloom time: Midsummer to mid-autumn.

Size: 2 to 10 feet tall; 1 to 3 feet wide.

Flower color: Yellow, gold, bronze or reddish brown. Growing advice: Full to



partial sun; well-draining soil. Recommendations: For tall yellow double flowers, choose Golden Glow; Becky Mixed is a dwarf annual with a mix of lemon-yellow to bright orange flowers.

## Japanese Anemone

Anemone x hybrida A plant well suited for a sunny bed, anemones produce saucer-shaped flowers throughout the fall season. Hardiness: Zones 4 to 8. Bloom time: Late summer to mid-autumn. Size: 4 to 5 feet high. Flower color: White or pink. Growing advice: Sun to partial shade; moist, humus-rich soil is ideal.

Recommendations: Queen Charlotte offers semi-double pink flowers; Whirlwind bears white flowers.

## Stonecrop

These drought-tolerant plants, a favorite in rock gardens and perennial borders, offer reliable, late-season blooms. Hardiness: Zones 3 to 10.

Bloom time: Summer to fall. Size: 6 to 36 inches tall: 6 to 24 inches wide.

Flower color: Yellow, pink, bronze, red or white.

Growing advice: Full sun. Recommendations: For a range of warm colors in fall, choose the upright Autumn Joy or Mohrchen, the lowgrowing Ruby Glow or the trailing sedum Cauticola.
