



# **Hot New Perennials for** the Coolest Garden

After a rather quiet two years of new perennial introductions, 2009 brings us some wonderful "new toys." An often-asked question is, "How many more new perennials do we really need?" New additions not only create renewed interest in gardening, they provide opportunities for new combinations, improved drought, disease and insect tolerance and longer enjoyment. After extensive research, I've found a few jewels that will really change up your garden.

One of the most outstanding is a new acanthus from Terra Nova Nurseries in Oregon called Tasmanian Angel™ (Zone 7). Its distinctive white and green variegated foliage is appealing

from spring through to late fall. Its soft pink spiky flowers are absolutely stunning. At a garden tour last summer, it was the number one "ooh and ahh" getter. Its flowers last for weeks

and its complementary foliage hangs on until frost.

Achilleas are getting better and better for long flowering and summer drought tolerance. The recent Seduction Series is all of the above. Achillea 'Saucy Seduction,' 'Strawberry Seduction' and 'Sunny Seduction' (Zone 4) are large flowered, great basal branching plants with real punchy hot pink, hot red and bright yellow colouring, respectively.






The leaves of B. 'Lunar Glow' turn burgundy tones in winter with variegations.



Acanthus 'Tasmanian Angel™

The first truly variegated bergenia, whose name will remain quietly unmentioned, was not so variegated its second season around. Bergenia 'Lunar Glow' (Zone 5) should correct that situation nicely.

Its lush yellow and rich green splashed leaves turn burgundy tones in winter with variegations, of

course, and its new growth is quite something. Its bright pink spring flowers only enhance its beauty.

Quite a few coreopsis have been introduced over the past few years and some nice ones too - but are you ready for a big bang? Coreopsis 'Big Bang™Red Shift' and 'Big Bang"

Full Moon' (Zone 5) sport huge 6-8cm (2.5-3") blossoms that change colour depending upon the summer heat. 'Red Shift' is red-yellow in the heat and deep crimson in cooler weather. 'Full Moon' will tend to be less vibrant when the sun's set on "roast." These two varieties are quite drought tolerant and will be great eye candy in any garden.

Not to say there aren't lots of nice dianthus out there, but the new 'Pop Star' and 'Starlette' are too silly to know when to quit blooming.

Seriously, we started them in a greenhouse late last summer and they bloomed rather quickly with goodsized soft pink and magenta flowers. Both varieties have a very strong carnation fragrance and neither know

when to quit blooming, even when frozen solid in a cold greenhouse they're still in bloom! Their flowers have strong stems and their foliage is an intense blue and seems to stand up well in winter, unlike so many of their relatives.

This is "The Year of the Bleeding Hearts," and I'm not talking about the recession. 'Spring Magic,' 'Candy Hearts' and 'King of Hearts' are all very nice.

But a terrific compact dicentra variety called 'Burning Hearts' (Zone 3) really caught my eye. Rising above masses of lacy blue foliage, these intensely deep red hearts raise the temperature in any garden.

This standout may not have the same vigour as the other two – but it's still a keeper.

good echinaceas are Echinacea 'Mac 'n' Cheese' and E. 'Tomato Soup' (Zone 4). As you would expect, 'Mac 'n' Cheese' is the same colour as this famous gourmet delight and 'Tomato Soup' has 12cm (5") red flowers. Wow!

If this isn't enough for you, how about a big fluffy 10cm (4") pink flower head called E. 'Pink Poodle' (Zone 4)? They're all good varieties from Terra Nova. As this will be our first season with them, I'm really hungry to see them.

The introduction of the geraniums 'Rozanne' and 'Jolly Bee' gave us the first non-stop blooming geraniums that single-handedly repositioned geraniums as long blooming perennials. Well, meet their mate, 'Sweet Heidi,' a perfect companion for the others with pink-toned flowers that create a geranium match made in gardening heaven.

Sometimes it seems as if the more we get new stuff, the more we come full circle. Lupines are in again - as are many old fashioned favourites but with a difference.

When I first saw the price of these new lupine plugs, I winced.

They had better walk on water! Well, the jury's still out until I see the first blooms this spring but the Westcountry™ Series, including Lupinus 'Masterpiece' and 'Manhattan Lights' (Zone 4), are supposed to be real zingers. They are both strong, husky

plants with thick stems that display unique colour blends, on L. 'Masterpiece,' and fantastic purple and yellow bicolour flowers, on L. 'Manhattan Lights,

These are but a few of the new introductions this year that should whet your appetite for adding new elements to your garden.

Because they are so new, you may have to track some of these varieties down. But like finding gold, it's pay dirt when you do. Have fun with them - [ know [ will.»
