dense, round head.

- *Viburnum obovatum*. This compact viburnum is another Florida native. It features masses of small, white flowers in early spring and again in fall.
- Zamioculcas zamiifolia. (ZZ plant) is an interesting succulent that can be used indoors and out.

LEGISLATION

H-2B legislation calls for returning worker extension

Sens. Barbara Mikulski and Arlen Specter introduced Senate Bill 388, "Save Our Small and Seasonal Businesses Act of 2009." The act is intended to extend the H-2B returning worker exemption for three years.

"Without these seasonal workers, many businesses will not survive — they'll be forced to limit services, lay off permanent U.S. workers or, worse yet, close their doors," Sen. Mikulski said in a released statement.

The Professional Landcare Network (PLANET) has a letter on its Web site to send to representatives and senators encouraging them to support the bill. The site also lists the bill's cosponsors.
